

# Is your child two?



---

## You could get 15 hours a week of free childcare at a nursery, pre-school or childminder if your family receives any of these benefits:

- Universal Credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (if you are unable to work due to illness or disability)
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit and earn £16,190 or less per year
- Working Tax Credit and earn £16,190 or less per year
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 Or your child
- receives Disability Living Allowance;
- has a current statement of special educational need or an Education, Health and Care plan; or
- has left care through special guardianship, child arrangement order or residence order.

That's 15 hours a week of playing, painting, reading, cooking, climbing, singing, dancing, dressing up, running around, building, gardening... whatever they like doing. But most of all, your child is learning with other children.

**That's also 15 hours a week for you – to have a break, get stuff done at home, study or look for work.**
